Elinor has visited over 500 US lighthouses, but this was her first time to Hillsboro Lighthouse Station!


FEBRUARY ART & PHOTO EXHIBIT

DAVID BUTLER REMEMBERED

David Butler, co-founder of Hillsboro Lighthouse Preservation Society in 1997, died September 7, 2003. He was president of our Society in 2001, taking on the role of vice president when struck with cancer a year later.

Even before HLPS was formed, Dave was fighting to keep the original lens in the lighthouse. He and Art Makenian (see p.6) saved the beam of light shining in the night (further to sea than any other lighthouse beam in the world) by designing a proper commercial ball bearing to support the lens. Dave published a book, *Hillsboro Lighthouse*, a history and technology of the light with last chapters describing recent renovations.

Dan Hobby, executive director of the Pompano Beach Historical Society, speaking of Dave Butler said, "Our knowledge of the past would be less rich if not for his work." Dave served on the Historical Society's board of directors from 1994 until his death and was president of the organization 1996 thru 1998.

Dave was an advisor for the Hillsboro Inlet District and on November 17th of this year they named the large steel work boat of the Inlet, *Dave Butler*.

The community has lost a real friend with David Butler's passing.

A BUSY FALL LIGHTHOUSE TOUR

The October 25th tour took place on a very windy Saturday. Waves broke over the rocks at the lighthouse shore adding to the excitement of this special day. The 300 plus members were especially interested in inspecting one of the restored keeper cottages. That activity alone brought "kids" who grew up here. Their children and grandchildren came, too, from as far off as Georgia and Tennessee. The Currys, Penders, Knights and Stones were represented.

HILLSBORO LIGHTHOUSE KEEPERS Last in the series

In our last issue, it was noted that The Lighthouse Service was taken over by the Coast Guard in 1939. Captain Stone did not want to retire as keeper, so he joined the Coast Guard. Ill health in 1942 forced him to retire. After that time the designated keepers were there short term, usually less than a year.

In 1997 when the Coast Guard began a renovation of the tower, including removal of mercury, Dennis Dever, the Officer in Charge, Coast Guard Aids to Navigation Team Miami, noticed the talents of Arthur Art had been a member of Flotilla 6 of Makenian. USCG Auxiliary and a member of the newly formed Hillsboro Lighthouse Preservation Society. He had contributed to the construction of the present Auxiliary Base in Boca Raton, the marine radio communications tower, and the removal of the old CG Base at Red Reef In 1998 Dever appointed Art Contracting Park. Officer's Technical Representative Observer for the rehab project. Art was to "visit the work site frequently, in uniform, to observe work progress and practices". Although he was not to personally change technical requirements or advise the contractor, Art was to relay noted discrepancies to Dever who noted, "Your experience and enthusiasm will play a valuable part in the successful outcome of this high profile renovation". After the first bearing failed in less than a month of use, Art and Dave Butler re-engineered the bearing support.

Art's background was very impressive — born in Alexandria, Egypt of Armenian parents, forced to leave Egypt during the 1956 Suez Canal War, and immigrating to America to join his mother. Art speaks fluently in five languages which helped him during his long career in the aerospace industry. Art served Pan American World Airways for eighteen years in many managerial positions within the Flight Operations,



Maintenance and Engineering Departments. Four of those years were spent at Pan America World Services that led him to establish residency on four continents. Ten additional years were devoted to General Electric Co., Aircraft Engine Group as Sales Executive and Customer Support Manager. His responsibilities extended to Eastern Europe and the Middle East. The last ten years of Art's professional career were devoted to building and initiating major aircraft maintenance service centers for international air carriers.

Within three months of receiving his volunteer job at Hillsboro Lighthouse, Art was appointed Light-house Keeper of this light by 7th District US Coast Guard. In this new confirmation letter he was told, "We are extremely fortunate to have you on our team. Your dedication and contributions to the renovation project truly defy description".

In April 2002, Art requested for termination as Hillsboro Inlet Lighthouse Keeper. He and his wife live within a few blocks of the lighthouse and he enjoys watching the beam of light sweep out to sea, remembering his part in changing darkness into light. He is now master of *China Clipper*, a 50' Chris Craft Constellation he beautifully restored. Art often takes her on Coast Guard assignments to help protect our SE Florida shoreline.


